SGS President-Elect Resigns Search for Replacement Ongoing

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At the SGS Membership Meeting and Reunion held virtually May 22, 2021, the SGS nominating committee presented a slate of prospective officers to fill elected positions on the SGS Executive Board. If approved, the officers on this slate would begin their terms on Oct. 1, 2021. Among them was Lynda Simmons who has served as SGS president since being elected at the 2015 SGS Membership Meeting and Reunion in Abilene, Kansas. The membership voted to accept the slate of officers.

Since then, Simmons has been called to perform a service for her church that will demand so much of her time, she felt it necessary to step aside in order to allow someone to give the SGS presidency the time and

attention it needs and deserves. She has shared a letter with details below.

As soon as the board was made aware of the situation, inquiries were made to begin identifying a successor. Article III, Section 4 of the SGS Bylaws state, "For an unexpired term of the President and/or a Vice President, succession shall be automatic from the remaining elected officers in the order shown in Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution, exclusive of the Treasurer."

Unfortunately, all the eligible elected officers have other commitments that preclude them from taking on the position of SGS president at this time. With that in mind, the nominating committee

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Highlights of the 19th SGS Membership Meeting and Reunion

The members of the Seely Genealogical Society had an interesting, informative, and fun Virtual SGS Membership Meeting and Reunion on May 22, 2021. It was good to see and interact with other members. We missed being together in person but being together virtually was the next best thing.

At our 2019 SGS Membership Meeting and Reunion in San Diego, SGS members decided to hold our next Reunion in St. Louis in 2021. Many plans were made about where to stay, what kind of activities we could have, and who might be good speakers from that area. We all wanted to see our Seeley cousins and visit with them in St. Louis, but as the Covid-19 pandemic progressed and

more people died, the Board decided caution was warranted.

The Board usually meets in Abilene, Kansas, each spring at the Seelye Research Center, but when we realized that this would not be possible, on April 24, 2020, the Board held its first entirely virtual meeting. Everyone was very happy to see each other and could not help thinking that this is one reason why SGS exists: it provides members opportunities to visit with Seeley cousins.

Since SGS First Vice President Paul Taylor is skilled in setting up and running Zoom meetings, this Board meeting went very well, and officers spent time considering revisions to the Constitution and discussing other business, especially where, when, and

how to hold the 2021 Membership Meeting and Reunion. During the remainder of 2020 and until May 2021, SGS increased the use of virtual meetings, finding them most valuable. Because of COVID, the Board met virtually several times, as did the Website, Research, and Reunion Planning Committees. Exchange of ideas and solutions to problems have also occurred much more quickly in these meetings than was often the case with in-person meetings or via e-mail.

Prior to the Reunion, the Reunion Planning Committee, which included Jesse Crisler, Stephanie Moore, Camille Bell, Connie Birth, Annette Earl, Linda Crocker, John Mills, Kelly Findley, Dave Petersen, Paul Taylor,

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approached the appointed officers to determine whether any of them would be able to serve. One of the appointed officers has graciously agreed to take on the position.

Since our constitution does not include instructions for this eventuality, it has been decided that the appropriate course of action is to have a meeting of the current SGS Executive Board (elected at the 2019 SGS Membership Meeting and Reunion in San Diego) to speak with the nominee and then formally ask SGS membership to vote for and elect a new SGS President. It is very important for you to vote because the SGS Constitution (Article IV, Section 1 and 4) requires the participation of ten percent of the membership. You will receive a biography of the nominee before you vote. A meeting of the SGS Executive Board will be

held at 7 p.m. Eastern on Sept, 21, 2021. An email will be sent to all SGS members following that meeting with the name of the nominee. It is imperative that when you receive this email, you respond immediately. Votes will be counted until 7 p.m. Sept. 28 when a special Zoom meeting will be held to announce the results and, hopefully, swear in our new President before the board takes office October 1. Here is the text of Lynda's resignation.

Dear Friends,

I want you to know how much I value your friendship and have loved being President of SGS. It has been a big part of my life for years, but I have had a big change come into my life.

As most of you know, I belong to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. I have just been called to be the Relief Society President of our

ward. In our church, we call our church geographic area a ward and my ward has 433 members in it. Our church has a volunteer clergy. Our Bishop works full time and depends on ward members to teach, help one another and fill different positions in the ward. The Relief Society President is over the women in the ward and the Elders Quorum President is over the men. We each have counselors and will work together to assist the Bishop in supporting families in our ward. In our church, we feel that when we are asked to serve that it is a calling from God.

Being Relief Society President is such a big job. I feel that I can't be in charge of two large groups at the same time and so need to resign as President of SGS. I am sorry that I have to do this because I love working

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with you. All of you have become dear friends! You are such capable, caring, dedicated people. I will miss you so much! I will miss working with you, but I promise I will be active in SGS and will attend all of the reunions that I can.

It is with a heavy heart that I step down from the SGS Presidency, but it is what I feel I must do. Thank you so much for all you have done for SGS and for your friendship!

and me, met virtually several times to attend to detail and anticipate possible problems that might occur during our first virtual Reunion. I thank all of them. All members also received a packet before the meeting, which included minutes of the 2019 SGS Membership Meetings, as recorded by SGS Secretary Patricia Palmer, officers' reports for 2019 and 2020, the Treasurer's report, prepared by SGS Treasurer Margaret Petersen, a report from the Audit Committee, comprised of Jesse and Lou Ann Crisler, a proposed slate of officers, submitted by Camille Seeley Bell, Chair of the Nominating Committee, and proposed revisions of the Constitution and Bylaws edited and revised by SGS Librarian Pam Turner and previously included in an issue of the Newsletter—all in preparation for the Reunion and Membership Meeting.

Finally, the greatly anticipated date for the virtual Reunion arrived. On May 22, 2021, Paul Taylor started the meeting a half hour ahead of time so that members could make sure they were properly connected and also visit with each other informally before the meeting. Everyone was again happy to interact with each other. Several Seeleys who had not attended a Reunion in the past were able to participate in of this virtual meeting. The theme for this Reunion was "Volunteers are the Heart of the Seeley Genealogical Society," since without great SGS officers and committee members, this meeting would not have been possible. There are many ways in which all members can help the Society. Please think of any talents, skills, prior work, and home experiences that you could put to use in SGS. The May 2021

Newsletter lists several specific areas in which SGS needs help.

I called the meeting to order with a rap of the gavel. Next, Lou Ann and Jesse Crisler, SGS Second Vice President, sang a song, which Lou Ann had written for the Reunion to the tune of "Mid Pleasures and Palaces," after which Lou Ann led all those attending in singing the song. Paul Taylor then gave a very informative history of the Seeley Genealogical Society, which included many little-known facts about SGS and how it has progressed over the years. Members then approved the minutes of the 2019 Membership Meeting.

Old Business followed, including a review of the 2019 Reunion and Members Surveys and the action steps taken in response to suggestions from members, the establishment of criteria for funding research on Seeley "brickwalls," increased use of media in continued development of the SGS Website, increased use of Zoom for meetings, more comprehensive presence on Facebook, development of a plan to attract new and younger members, focus on keeping present members, encouragement of all SGS members to volunteer, complete redesign of SGS Website, including continued transfer of information from the old website to the new one, more involvement in the Seeley DNA Lineage Project, focus on future SGS Membership and Reunion Meetings, and revisions of both the Sixth and Seventh Generation Books done by Pam Turner with the help of SGS Chief Genealogist Linda Crocker, SGS Past President Kathie Olsen, and Jesse Crisler.

At the request of Camille Seeley

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Bell, Chair of the Nominating Committee, Annette Seeley Earl presented the proposed slate of officers for the 2021-2023 term to Society members, who then voted unanimously to elect them, after which Annette swore in the newly elected officers. All current officers but one had agreed to serve for another term. Ruthetta Seelye Hansen, SGS Director and Historian, had asked to be released for personal reasons. Chris Havnar who is still very involved in the SGS Website and serves as Co-chair of the Ancestor File, was elected as a Director to replace Ruthetta, and I appointed Annette Seeley Earl as Historian. Members also unanimously approved the proposed changes to the Constitution and Bylaws. Pam Turner, Chair of the Constitution Committee, spent many hours with the help of Board members to develop changes necessary to bring the documents up to date and reflect changes in technology. Finally, members were informed that the Board had decided to hold the 2023 Reunion and Membership Meeting in St. Louis, the site originally selected by the membership for 2021.

Margaret Petersen, along with other Society members, voted to elect officers for 2021-2023.

At each reunion, the Seeley Genealogical Society recognizes an outstanding volunteer. This year SGS recognized two outstanding members as Volunteers of the Year, Terry Tietjens and Ruthetta Seelye Hansen, both of whom have been members for many year and have held many offices. Jesse Crisler's review of the service to SGS by both of them appears later in the Souvenir Reunion Book. Michael Hook presented a

plaque to Terry at the Seelye Mansion in Abilene; a similar presentation was arranged for Ruthetta a few days later. At the end of our SGS Membership Meeting, Paul Taylor took a group "photo" of all members attending, and the meeting was adjourned.

Following a short break, members then heard several excellent presentations. Kara Seelye Donaldson, Chair of the Seeley DNA Lineage Project, presented easily understood information about using DNA to connect with ancestors and living relatives and answered many questions about DNA during and after her presentation. Paul Taylor reported on the state of the Facebook page, which he established in 2011. Paul, who tries to post almost daily to increase interest in the Society, asked for seven volunteers, who were interested in posting as well. Michael Hook, President of the Seelye Mansion Foundation and Developmental Coordinator of Old Abilene Town, then took members on a virtual tour of the Seelye Mansion, showing many wonderful furnishings in this beautiful home. Logan Seelye, a professional Web designer, creator of the 10 and 90 Foundation, and grandson of Dan Seelye, who began the Website years ago, has continued to develop it under the direction of Paul Taylor and with the help of Chris Havnar and the Website Committee; Logan took members through the Website, explained features in each section, and showed how each section worked. It has been exciting to watch the transition to the new Website. Finally, Stephanie Mills Moore, who grew up in St. Louis and is a member of the Reunion Planning Committee, previewed St. Louis as the site of the

Constitution and Bylaws

Constitution

(Revised May 22, 2021, Effective October 1, 2021)

ARTICLE I: Name

- SECTION 1. The name of this organization shall be THE SEELEY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY, hereinafter referred to as “the Society or SGS.”
- SECTION 2. The Reverend Garner Osborne is recognized as the founder of the society. Any person who was a member prior to 1965 is a charter member.

ARTICLE II: Objectives

- SECTION 1. The Society shall solicit as members, descendants of the Seeley surname of all spellings to include those who by marriage have acquired another surname, and anyone who has an interest in genealogy. Known surname spelling variants include Seelye, Seely, Selee, Sealey, Sealy, Seela, Cilley, Ceely, Ceilly, and Ceilley; however, all similar spellings or variants are included.
- SECTION 2. The Society shall engage in research, study, verification, discussion, collation, publication, dissemination, and preservation of Seeley information for the education and benefit of its members and for posterity. In so far as practical, the Society shall respond to all that inquire about Seeley ancestral lines. The Society shall receive, hold and invest appropriate monies, dues, gifts, proceeds from sales, interest, etc., and control and administer any properties for the benefit of the Society. The Society shall publish a periodic Newsletter.
- SECTION 3. The Society shall establish and maintain associations with societies of other surnames and state and national organizations to encourage interest in genealogy and to benefit therefrom.
- SECTION 4. The Society shall pay special recognition to Robert Seeley of England who immigrated to America in anno domini 1630; and to Obadiah Seeley, who appeared in the records of Stamford, Connecticut in 1640.
- SECTION 5. The Society shall maintain the Seelye Research Center, co-located with the Seelye Mansion in Abilene, Kansas. The Research Center shall collect family and archival records for research by the membership and members of the general public.

ARTICLE III: Membership, Dues and Fiscal Year

- SECTION 1. There shall be three classes of membership in the Society:
- (1) Charter: Persons who participate in founding and administration of the Society prior to 1965.
 - (2) Individual, Library, or Society
 - (3) Lifetime
- Charter, Individual, and Lifetime memberships shall apply to a member and spouse with one vote allotted per membership.
- SECTION 2. Dues shall be specified in the SGS Newsletter subject to revision per Article I of the Bylaws.
- SECTION 3. Any and all references within the Constitution and Bylaws referring to the fiscal year shall refer to the period from October 1 through September 30.

ARTICLE IV: Officers

- SECTION 1. The elected officers of the Society shall be a President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Chief Genealogist, and three Directors elected from the general membership. The elected officers and directors shall constitute the Executive Board. Voting members

of the Executive Board must be elected and not appointed.

SECTION 2. The President shall appoint an Ancestor Files Chair, a Membership Chair, a Director of Communication, Assistant Genealogists as required, and a Director for the Seelye Research Center.

SECTION 3. Any member of the SGS may hold the position of an elected or appointed officer within the SGS.

ARTICLE V: Meetings

SECTION 1. The membership shall meet at least every two years, physically or virtually, as specified in the Bylaws. Business of the Society may be conducted if there is a quorum present at the Membership Meeting.

SECTION 2. The officers and Executive Board shall meet as specified in the Bylaws and serve without monetary compensation.

SECTION 3. The order of business at all meetings shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, Revised. The President may appoint a Parliamentarian, who shall serve at the pleasure of the president.

SECTION 4. To conduct business of the Society at a Membership Meeting, a quorum of ten percent of the membership shall be required. Five elected officers shall constitute a quorum of the Executive Board.

ARTICLE VI: Indemnification

SECTION 1. The Society shall indemnify, to the fullest extent permitted by law, any officer or member of the Executive Board for liability resulting from acts taken on behalf of the Society in an official capacity. Individuals shall be entitled to indemnification only to the extent that their conduct was authorized by the Society. The Executive Board shall take action as may be necessary to authorize an appropriate amount of indemnification, after consulting with legal counsel. This indemnification shall not apply: (1) if an individual has breached a fiduciary duty, failed to act in good faith or failed to act in the best interest of the Society and (2) if that breach or failure to perform constitutes self-dealing, willful misconduct, or recklessness. This exemption from personal liability shall not apply to any individual who is deemed liable pursuant to criminal statutes or who may be liable for payment of any local, state, or federal taxes.

ARTICLE VII: Disposition of Assets upon Dissolution of the Seeley Genealogical Society

SECTION 1. At the time that the dissolution of the Seeley Genealogical Society becomes necessary, all remaining assets shall be transferred to one or more entities that are involved in collecting, disseminating, and archiving genealogical information available for general public use. The Executive Board shall distribute such remaining assets to such entities with similar objectives as outlined in the SGS Constitution, provided that they meet IRS Section 501 (c) (3) requirements.

Bylaws

(Revised May 22, 2021, Effective October 1, 2021)

ARTICLE I: Dues and Membership

SECTION 1. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to periodically review the dues structure to ensure the fiscal integrity of the Society. Changes proposed by the Executive Board must be approved by a three-fifths vote of the membership at a Membership Meeting, or through acceptable communication channels as determined by the Executive Board, subject to quorum requirements and the minimum requirements of Article V, Sections 1 and 4 of the Constitution. Dues are to be paid to the Treasurer who will send the members' documentation to the Membership Chair.

SECTION 2. Membership shall be awarded as specified in Article II, Section 1 of the Constitution.

SECTION 3. Membership may be refused or suspended by a three-fifths vote of the Executive Board to anyone or any organization, whose interests conflict with the purpose of the Society.

ARTICLE II: Meetings

SECTION 1: The President, with the approval of the Executive Board, shall call meetings of the Board and the general membership subject to the minimum requirements of Article V, Sections 1 and 2 of the Constitution.

SECTION 2. It is recommended that the President call a meeting of the Executive Board at least once a year. The Society recognizes the geographical dispersion of the officers and directors. The President and Executive Board may conduct business by any method that permits all participants to communicate adequately with each other. Minutes of Board Meetings shall be reported to the membership in the Newsletter. An in-person meeting of officers and directors is encouraged when it is practical.

SECTION 3. Six (6) members of the Executive Board may call a special meeting of the Executive Board for consideration of issues. A special meeting of the Executive Board may also be called by ten percent of the membership of the Society by signed petition, at no expense to the Society. Quorum requirements shall apply.

ARTICLE III: Election of Officers and Directors

SECTION 1. Officers and Directors of the Society shall be elected for a term of two years. The election shall take place at the Membership Meeting. Officers and members in good standing shall be eligible to vote. A quorum of ten percent of the membership shall be required for a valid election.

SECTION 2. The officers' and directors' term of office shall begin on October 1 following the election or reelection of officers and directors at the Membership Meeting. There shall be no limit to the number of terms an individual may serve in any position.

SECTION 3. No member shall hold more than one elected office at a time, except for short times resulting from succession to office as provided for in Article III, Section 4.

SECTION 4. In the event of the resignation or incapacity of any officer, except the President or a Vice President, the vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of the remaining elected officers. For an unexpired term of the President and/or a Vice President, succession shall be automatic from the remaining elected officers in the order shown in Article IV, Section 1 of the Constitution, exclusive of the Treasurer.

SECTION 5. If there is more than one nominee for any office, elections shall be by secret ballot, and a majority of the voting quorum shall elect.

ARTICLE IV: Duties of Elected Officers

SECTION 1. President: The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Society, shall preside at all meetings, and shall be a member of all committees except the nomination and auditing committees. The President is authorized to approve disbursement of reasonable fund amounts from the Treasurer's account(s) for the routine operation of the Society business, to carry on correspondence and to publish the Newsletters. The President shall serve as the chair of the committee to organize the Membership Meeting conducted per Article V, Section 1 of the Constitution.

SECTION 2. If the President determines that an elected officer or director is not performing the duties for which elected, the President may request that the Executive Board remove the member from the Board. Such removal shall require a three-fifths vote of the eligible Executive Board members.

SECTION 3. First Vice President: The First Vice President shall perform duties assigned by the President, preside and perform all duties necessary in the absence of the President, and assume the Presidency if the office becomes vacant.

SECTION 4. Second Vice President: The Second Vice President shall perform duties assigned by the President, preside and perform all duties necessary in the absence of the President and First Vice President.

SECTION 5. Secretary: The Secretary shall record and preserve the minutes of the meetings of the Executive Board and of the Membership Meetings. The Secretary shall perform other administrative duties as assigned by the President.

SECTION 6. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall safeguard the funds and maintain all accounts in the name of The Seeley Genealogical Society and shall be responsible for maintaining adequate financial records. When the Executive Board shall determine bonding is required, this shall be done at the expense of the Society. If investment of funds of the Society is made, approval of the Executive Board is required.

- SECTION 7. Chief Genealogist: The Chief Genealogist shall have custody of the genealogical files of the Society, maintain such other files necessary for performing assigned duties, and safeguard them from common hazards. The duties are those generally accepted as responsibilities of a genealogist. The Chief Genealogist shall be assisted by genealogists appointed by the President and shall also work closely with the Director of the Seelye Research Center to assure that all Society records are copied and/or archived at the Center for researchers' use.
- SECTION 8. Directors: The three Directors shall serve as representatives of the general membership. They may be assigned duties by the President to assist in the administration of the Society.
- SECTION 9. Past President: The immediate Past President shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Board and committees in a non-voting advisory capacity.
- SECTION 10. The President, with the approval of the Executive Board, may establish other positions and collateral duties not named elsewhere.

ARTICLE V: Duties of Appointed Officers

- SECTION 1. Director of Communication: The Director of Communication shall be responsible for overseeing all aspects of the Society's external and internal communication in accordance with this document, the directions of the President, and the best interests of SGS. This may include, but is not limited to, publishing a Newsletter and other publications of SGS, management of the Society's online properties, and other duties as assigned. The Director shall be assisted by volunteers and others appointed by the President.
- SECTION 2. Ancestor Files Chair: The Ancestor Files Chair shall be responsible for maintaining a computerized database, in coordination with the Chief Genealogist, of all ancestor files submitted by members of the Society and shall also be responsible for responding to inquiries to the Society regarding established lineage.
- SECTION 3. Research Center Director: The Research Center Director shall be responsible for maintaining the Seelye Research Center in Abilene, Kansas, as a resource for Society members and the general public and shall act as an advisor to the President and to the Chief Genealogist.
- SECTION 4. Membership Chair: The Membership Chair shall be responsible for the promotion of the Society membership and the maintenance of membership rolls. The Membership Chair shall be appointed by the President from the membership, exclusive of the Treasurer.
- SECTION 5. Assistant Genealogists: Assistant Genealogists, when appointed, shall be responsible for specific tasks in support of the Chief Genealogist's function.

ARTICLE VI: Committees

- SECTION 1. The President shall appoint necessary standing and ad hoc committees and require reports from them.
- SECTION 2. Nominating Committee: The President shall appoint a nominating committee of at least two (2) members one year in advance of the Membership Meeting. The nominating committee shall ascertain that all candidates nominated are willing to serve if elected. The election shall proceed as provided in Article III of these bylaws. Nominations may be made from the floor for all offices with the consent of the nominee.
- SECTION 3. Auditing Committee: The President shall appoint an auditing committee, independent of the treasurer, of not less than two (2) members to examine the financial records of the Society, once every two years, or more often if required by the Executive Board. The results shall be presented to the membership in attendance at each Membership Meeting and submitted in writing for publication in the Newsletter.

ARTICLE VII: Amendments and/or Revisions

- SECTION 1. Amendments and/or revisions to the Constitution and the Bylaws shall require approval by a three-fifths vote of the membership at a Membership Meeting, or through acceptable communication channels as determined by the Executive Board, subject to the quorum requirements and the minimum requirements of Article V — Sections 1 and 4 of the Constitution. All proposed changes shall be printed in the Newsletter for membership review a minimum of three months prior to the Membership Meeting.

A luncheon was served and immediately afterward the bride and groom left for the South. Among the friends and relatives present from a distance were Mr. and Mrs. B. N. Harrison, and Mrs. Charles Thorpe and sons, of Cincinnati; Maj. and Mrs. Ed Rosser of Harrisburg, Kentucky; Mr. and Mrs. Roger Lillard of Lawrenceburg, Kentucky; Miss Annie Shanks of Stanford, Kentucky; and Mr. Addison Hall of

 - #2 about 1851-1878, located at Laclede and Market Sts., west of Grand; during the Civil War several hundred Union soldiers were bd. there but later moved to Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, abandoned in 1874, other graves moved to the "New" Wesleyan Cemetery on Olive at Hanley in 1878.
 - #3 1878-1952, "New" Wesleyan Cemetery, located at southeast corner of Olive near Hanley, University City, Central Township, closed in 1952, remains of early Chinese Americans in northwest corner of cemetery removed to China, about 800 burials moved to Memorial Park Cemetery, about 150 to Bellefontaine Cemetery, any military burials to Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, many family members claimed ancestors for reburial.
 - Wesleyan Cemetery does not exist today. All bodies were moved elsewhere from the last cemetery; the site is now commercial property; cemetery records are available at the Saint Louis Genealogical Society

Conclusion: Ralph's mother seems to be Amanda M. Bowser, and John married 2nd Catherine (Kate) Thrope/Thorpe, mother of Orville Nelson Seely, half-brother of Ralph. I could not identify John M. Seely/Sealy in earlier census records, nor could I find other Seely/Sealys in Warren Co., OH, in 1850 or 1840 except for Hannah age 69 and Jane age 26, both b. PA in Lebanon, Warren, OH in 1850. I could not find other information on them either. If you have anything to contribute, please get in touch with us.

Chris had an obituary for Suzanne Meier of Waitsfield, VT, who d. March 29, 2021, originally from Halifax, Nova

Scotia. The obituary stated that Suzanne was b. in 1942 in Halifax, the daughter of Douglas and Margaret Seely; she was preceded in death by her brother Stephen and had three children by her first husband, Sidney Oland: Linda, Victor, and Heather. What is Douglas Seely's ancestry?

SGS Response: Searching on Ancestry did not turn up Douglas, so I turned to Google, looking for an obituary for a Douglas Seely in Halifax. That led me to the obituary of his wife, Margaret, on the SGS Website (of course!), which named her husband as H. Douglas Seely and her maiden name as Mussett. That still did not help me on Ancestry. I have a copy of *The Seelys of New Brunswick*, compiled by Harold Fanjoy and C. G. "Hap" Ward in 1992, so I tried the index. Margaret was married to Hial Douglas Seely. He is in the SGS Ancestor File as an 11th-generation descendant of Obadiah. His line is Hial, Douglas, Donald John Underhay, Jacob Jerome, Robert (SGS# 3233), Jerome, Seth, Obadiah, Obadiah, Obadiah, Obadiah. I did not find an obituary for Hial Douglas Seely nor for Suzanne's brother Stephen Seely, both of Halifax according to Margaret's obituary. If you find one, please send it to Chris to add to our Website and Ancestral File.

Douglas asked why SGS does not have Nathaniel Seeley's grave marked at Smith's Castle.

SGS Response: According to Wikipedia, Smith's Castle, located near Warwick, RI, is one of the oldest houses in the state. It was designated a National Historic Landmark in 1993 as Cocumscussoc Archeological Site, due to the artifacts and information digs in the vicinity. It was built in 1678 to replace an earlier structure destroyed by the Narragansett Tribe during King Philip's War. Approximately forty soldiers were buried on the property, including Nathaniel Seeley, SGS#2, son of Robert. You can read more about Smith's Castle at www.smithscastle.org.

review your letter with the Board of Trustees before I responded to your letter.

The grave marker of the forty men who died from injuries during the Great Swamp Fight was placed on the grounds by the state of Rhode Island in 1907. The latter marker you referred to is that of John Gallup which was placed by the family there with permission from the board in 1969. Since that time the historic house and property have come under the purview of the Rhode Island Historic Preservation Commission, and any changes or additions to the property must be approved by them.

As such, we currently have no plans to add to the Colonial Soldiers monument.

I have written to the Society of Colonial Wars which now helps us to maintain the area and suggested that an annual ceremony with the reading of the names of those killed might be a possible solution for descendants and veterans like yourself to commemorate the lives of those men. I will follow up with you and let you know if such a ceremony could take place. It would then be filmed, and copies sent out to interested parties.

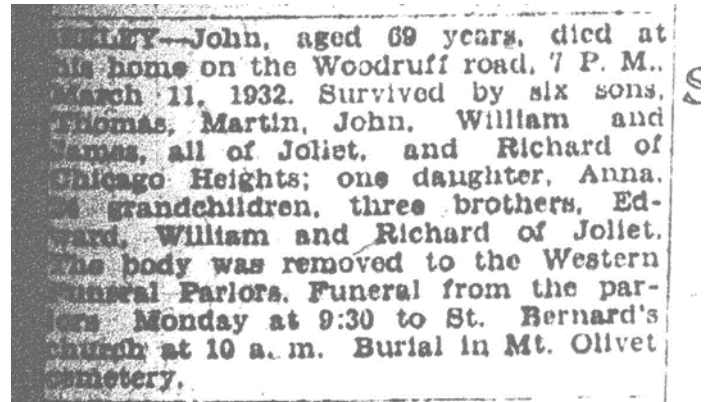
Chris has found obituaries and other records for several descendants of a John J Seeley, b. 1864 in Ireland. He was already in the SGS Ancestral File with his family, since they appear in the 1900 US census, and one of our early database people had entered many people from that census. SGS Response: Findagrave has John listed as John Joseph Seeley, b. Jan 15, 1863 in County Tipperary, Ireland, to Richard Sealy. John d. Mar 11, 1932 in Joliet, Will, IL. John is bd. in Mt Olivet Cemetery in Joliet. The site also lists his wife, Anna Walsh (1864-1924), and eleven children (three were born after 1900). It also shows his obituary (below) as well as those of four of his children.

Findagrave says that Anna married John on Sep 25, 1884, at Gathabawn, County Kilkenny, Ireland. There is also an entry in Findagrave for John's brother William, which names his parents as Richard (1830-1913)



and Catherine Berry (1832-1902) of Garrynamann, County Kilkenny, Ireland. The other siblings of John and William listed include Ellen Seeley Lockwood (1867-1931), Richard (1874-1950), and Edward (1880-1933). They all lived in Joliet at some point, although Edward returned to Ireland and d. there and Richard d. in Sarasota, FL Their father Richard d. in in the Dingle Union Workhouse in County Kerry, Ireland, Mar 29, 1913 and is bd. there.

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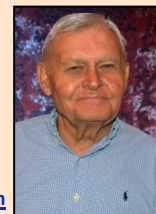
